#### CYMBIDIUM CULTURE NOTES (OCTOBER/NOVEMBER 2009) by Roy Brown

Re-potting should be in full swing, but by the middle of November the temperature will be fairly high, so it would be advisable to have all the repotting done by the first week in November at the latest.

When dividing your plants try not to break them up into sections that are too small, a three bulb piece will have a better chance of flowering the following year.

Try not to over-pot your plant, select a pot that will hold the plant and its root system, and allow for a further two years growth.

When repotting, hold the plant firmly in one hand one inch below the top of the pot, and using your fingers work the fresh pine bark between the plants roots.

Fill the pot to about 1/2 inch from the rim, firming the bark as you go. The plant should now be sitting neatly in the centre of the pot with the base of the bulb just below the top of the bark.

Give the plant a good watering and place it in a cool, shady position for about a week until the roots start into active growth again.

When the flower spikes have been cut and the plant repotted, you will find the new seasons leads will shoot ahead, so keep them growing strongly. Increase the fertiliser to weekly or fortnightly intervals. In the growing season Cymbidiums love plenty of light, water and a regular feeding programme.

#### CATTLEYA CULTURE NOTES (OCTOBER/NOVEMBER 2009) by Henry Eaton

So far this year we have experienced rather dry weather with little rain. Temperatures though have not been excessive yet and it is still good growing time. Those plants that need re-potting can still be attended to as soon as possible before the hot summer weather arrives.

As the weather warms up further, you should assess the degree of shade needed to keep your plants protected. The best indication for this is the colour of the leaves. If the leaves are a deep green in colour it indicates that the plants are too shaded, while reddening of the leaves indicates that too much light is hitting the plants. The ideal is to have a greenish yellow leaf colour.

At this time of the year fertilising can be carried out once a week or every fortnight with a high Nitrogen product. Fertilising is best done the day after the plants have been given a thorough watering to flush out salts in the mix.

Because of the warmth, be on the lookout for caterpillars, scale and mealy bug that multiply very quickly in these conditions. Treat them as soon as they are identified as causing trouble.
